My best friend and forever caregiver was assassinated June 19, 1970. My brother, Officer Richard Radetich, Star #703, was doing his job protecting the citizens of San Francisco when his assailant shot him three times in the head. He died that night, and his killer was never caught. The collateral damage to my family was tragic. To protect my parent's privacy, I will not reveal details, but they both died shortly after Richard was killed. I will leave you to imagine what I endured.

A casual "Happy New Year" phone call in January with a former BALEAF Board member resulted in a gift of money that I never expected. She served on the BALEAF Board with me when I was President. We both have a lot of respect for each other, resulting from our shared commitment to the law enforcement community. I filled her in on my health, as I had recently suffered two strokes, and two hospitalizations, never thinking that she would contact the BALEAF Board on my behalf. I really should not be surprised, as she was a dedicated BALEAF Board member and is currently a skilled Occupational Therapist at Stanford University, and a person of the highest caliber and compassion.

Thank you does not measure the deep appreciation that I have for BALEAF's gift to me. I was able to hire a caregiver immediately, which relieved the burden on me to take care of myself at a crucial time. BALEAF stepped up to the plate without hesitation, filling the need that was left empty by Richard's death. If Richard were alive, he would not have left my side during my illness.

I had the honor of serving as BALEAF President for two years. I lived and breathed BALEAF, for those two years, while holding down a full-time job at the University of San Francisco. I have firsthand experience in serving the needs of the Law Enforcement community, so those that need help get it. My BALEAF Board and I dispensed hundreds of dollars of funds. I am happy to say that I am recovering well.
